September 10, 2024 Meeting Minutes

President's Report:



President Warren Na'ai brought the meeting to order at 6:03 p.m. The meeting was recorded and will be available for viewing on YouTube.

New members Gernot (father) and Owen (son) Sherwood were introduced as new members. Welcome!

Warren discussed the Arbor Day celebration at Maili Community Center on Friday, November 8, 10am-2pm. A sign-up sheet for volunteers was circulated.

Andy Cole gave an overview of the 2024 Hawaii's Woodshow running from November 17-24. It is a prestigious showcase for artists working with Hawaii-grown wood.

Bruce Soll described our progress in preparing for another exhibit and demo at the Oahu Country Club. The event kicks off on January 16, 2025. Club members are encouraged to display and sell their works. Display pedestals will need to be constructed for the show. There will be a group event for members to make them.

Tommy Uno came up to discuss September's Nohea Gallery woodturning show beginning on the 28th. Members are welcome to sell their creations and, if desired, donate the proceeds to the Hawaii Food Bank. The period for members to drop their works at Nohea Gallery is from 9/16-25.

To make way for the rail, a beloved monkey pod tree next to the Queen Ka'ahumanu Circuit Court must be removed. The tree will be cut down 10/2 and the wood will be available for members to pick up from 10/3 through the weekend. To honor the tree, Robert Duffer will also be coordinating a collaborative project where members will design and create a monkey pod wood art piece for display in the court building.

Treasurer's Report:

Rob Faris reported the account balance on 9/10/24 was \$12372.70.

Evening's Demonstration:

Renowned woodturner Aaron Hammer treated us to an informative woodturning demonstration. While his talk was focused on fundamental techniques, it was of value to woodturners with all levels of experience.

Aaron started his demonstration with spindle turning. In his woodturning classes, this is where he starts with beginners. The skills learned here, such as turning beads and coves, are also utilized in bowl turning. Honing your technique here will pay dividends when working on other projects.

Aaron went on to show a practical way of developing your spindle turning skills: turning a bottle stopper. This is something he's done countless times and can do it in short order! The magnificent gloss you see in the photo is from a coat of mineral oil followed by French polish. Aaron makes his own French polish using 80% shellac, 15% linseed oil and 5% denatured alcohol.

Finally, Aaron demonstrated his process for turning a bowl. To pull the demo together, he showed how cuts we make when bowlturning are actually variations of forming beads and coves!


